

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PRECINCT OFFICERS, DELEGATES, AND ALTERNATES

It is time to step up to the plate and take back our country from the Democrats in all levels of government... locally, in our city councils and school boards, and in St. Paul and Washington, D.C. It all starts in your precinct with organizing your neighbors and turning them out to vote.

Precinct officers are elected for a two (2) year term. Responsibilities of a precinct officer:

- represent the Republican Party to the voters in your Precinct.
- attend Officer leadership training.
- support Candidates and the Party financially.
- recruit volunteers and assist candidates and your BPOU by helping with fundraising events, get-out-the-vote phoning, door knocking, volunteer recruitment, and sign placement.
- fill your Precinct delegation for BPOU conventions. If any Delegates are not attending, recruit Alternates to attend and fill missing Delegate seats.

Delegates and alternates are also elected for a two (2) year term. Responsibilities of a delegate or alternate:

- work with Precinct and BPOU officers to elect endorsed Republican candidates.
- attend ALL conventions and educate yourself on the issues you will be voting on.
- recruit an alternate to take your place if you are unable to attend any convention.
- support candidates, your BPOU, and the Party financially.
- assist candidates and your BPOU with fundraising events, get-out-the-vote phoning, door knocking, volunteer recruitment, and sign placement.

EXAMPLES of activities precinct officers, delegates, and alternates have organized in the past to fulfill their duties:

- door knock all the Republican voters in your precinct in a get-out-the-vote effort. The state party can provide the lists and the Advantage app.
- call all the Republican voters in your precinct in a get-out-the-vote effort. The state party can provide the lists and the Red Dialer automatic calling program.
- door knock (or call) all the unidentified voters in your precinct to update their voter records in the database so candidates have hard IDs on voters.
- door knock all the voters who have recently moved into your precinct and register them to vote in MN.
- contact all the Republican voters in your precinct and ask for their PCRs or host a fundraiser..
- host a Republican block party and deliver invitations by hand to everyone in your precinct.
- host a meet and greet for an endorsed candidate in your precinct and deliver invitations by hand to everyone in the precinct.
